

# **UHRC – Eastern Rules**

The goal behind UHRC Eastern is to accommodate shooters who wish to compete in the sport, but may be limited in stage design by the available space, the terrain, and/or the vegetation of the region they live in. By compressing target distances, we are able to more closely mimic the shooting lanes and ranges at which realistic hunting shots may occur in certain parts of the country. Much of this nation - where a vast number of hunters reside- is grossly underrepresented in the rifle sport world, and limited to mostly flat-range shooting venues due to the distances typically required in rifle sports, including the original Ultimate Hunter rule set.

We aim to change that with implementation of UHRC Eastern.

## **STAGE DESIGN RULES**

- Each stage must include three targets which must be engaged from designated shooting areas marked with boundary rope or some other non-moveable cordage type line indicator affixed to the ground. There can be one, two or three shooting areas (as many shooting areas as there are targets) on any single stage. Each target will fall within a distance bracket (+/- 10 yard discrepancy, ranged line-of-sight from the shooting area):

-A near target between 100-175 yards (RED MARKER PLACARD).

-A middle target between 176-250 yards (WHITE MARKER PLACARD).

-A far target between 251-300 yards (BLUE MARKER PLACARD).

- All other UHRC rules apply...only the target distances are changed for Eastern Rules.
